DAS International aims to provide holistic assessment and professional tutoring services to students in the region who have a range of Specific Learning Differences, behavioural difficulties and developmental disorders, so that they can achieve and reach their full potential. This service is delivered through a multi-professional team of qualified and registered Educational Psychologists, Speech-Language Therapists and Specialist Teachers. The level of service provided to individuals and schools in the region is of the highest standard through using up-to-date and evidence-based resources.

We are looking for individuals with a passion in teaching children but are not able to commit to a full time job. Candidates must be able to commit to a minimum of 8 teaching hours per week. All candidates must be registered with the Ministry of Education (MOE) before they can start teaching at the DAS.

About our Specialist Tutoring Programme

Specialist Tutoring aims to motivate the young mind to develop a love of learning to become happy, successful and independent learners.

Specialist tutoring is offered on a one-to-one basis, small group basis and even through online tutoring. It is tailored to meet the profile of the children through the Individual Education Plan (IEP) and takes a problem solving approach that targets individual needs. Our ultimate aim is to help our students cope or even perform well in their Ministry of Education (MOE) Singapore schools or International schools.

Specialist Tutors work with children who may have a Specific Learning Difficulty (SpLD). This could include teaching children with mild to moderate learning difficulties, specific learning difficulties such as dyslexia, hearing or visual impairment, children with emotional or behavioral problems, and children with autism. However, some students may simply be struggling to keep up with a fast paced curriculum. Specialist Tutors work closely and meet up regularly with parents to give feedback, advice and encouragement for their child’s individual learning needs.

The duties of a Specialist Tutor include

- Creating a dynamic curriculum for individuals in consultation with the Head of DAS International.
- Preparing lessons and resources.
- Teaching individuals and/or small groups of students.

- Developing and adapting conventional teaching methods to meet the individual needs of students.
- Using special facilities, such as audiovisual materials and computers, to stimulate interest in learning.
- Conducting ongoing formative and summative assessments for students.
- Consulting, if required, with Speech-Language Therapists and Educational Psychologists.
- Liaising closely with parents.
- Liaising with international schools.
- Updating and maintaining records on students' progress.

TRAINING PROVIDED

The DAS places great emphasis on providing a professional service. For Specialist Tutors, training may vary depending on factors such as qualifications and experience. Some of the courses Specialists Tutors may be required to attend are:

- Professional Certificate Course in Individual Education Plans (IEP) Planning for SpLD Learners. Practicum is a required component of the training.
- Certificate in Dyslexia Studies and Specialist Diploma in Learning Support for SpLD.

The DAS will fully sponsor the course fees for the training. In view of the sponsorship, there is a 2-year minimum service period (MSP).

While the DAS is invested in providing training and support, Specialist Tutors are expected to invest their personal time for the training and other matters such as attending lectures, completing the necessary course work and preparing lesson plans for the classes they are teaching.

MINIMUM SERVICE PERIOD

In view of the full sponsorship by the DAS for the training course fees, there is a 2-year minimum service period (MSP) that Specialist Tutors have to serve. The MSP will start from the date of the first teaching class.

Compensation to the DAS is payable should the Specialist Tutor not fulfil the MSP obligations.

During this 2-year MSP, Specialist Tutors are expected to fulfil 640 teaching hours (at a minimum of 8 hours per week).

<p>In view of the demand for classes on weekday afternoons and nights, Saturdays and Sundays, Specialist Tutors must note that they will be more effective if they are prepared to work flexible hours when our clients are available.</p>		
WORK VENUE		
<p>Specialist Tutors will be expected to work at the DAS Learning Centres requiring Specialist Tutoring, or provide in-school support at the International Schools.</p>		
SALARY AND BENEFITS		
<p>Successful candidates will be paid between S\$45 to S\$70 per hour depending on relevant qualifications and teaching experience. These rates are for teaching hours only, and hours for lesson preparation and training will not be paid.</p>		
<p>Hours spent on visits to International Schools will not be paid as this is part of building relations with the student and teacher.</p>		
<p>Specialist Tutors will receive benefits such as medical coverage for outpatient treatment, pro-rated leave entitlement for sick leave, maternity and childcare leave (subject to meeting prevailing eligibility criteria) and variable bonus.</p>
