

OUR APPROACH

DAS International has a team of specialist tutors who have extensive experience in supporting students with specific learning differences and other learning needs.

Specialist Tutoring is an individualised, one-on-one service that is tailored to meet the needs of students with learning differences. Tutoring is provided based on the profile of the child obtained from our multidisciplinary team of educational psychologists, speech and language therapists and in consultation with parents and educators. Specialist Tutoring has an individualised problem solving approach where skills focused include:

- Literacy, Numeracy, Oracy, & Writing Skills
- Individual Curriculum support
- Study skills and Exam preparation
- Behaviour and Social support

Our tutors are experienced in the international, private and public school systems; they have an understanding of the curriculum and the demands that today's education systems place on your child. They listen with sensitivity to the concerns that parents have and provide a total solution with an Individualised Education Plan to support their child's needs. Regular verbal feedback is provided at the end of each tuition session. Informal assessments on progress is made to monitor and track your child's progress. We strive to empower successful learning and nurture each individual child to achieve their full potential.

DAS International, a wholly owned subsidiary of the Dyslexia Association of Singapore since its inception in 2011 has been providing one to one Specialist support for students with literacy and Maths challenges through a customised one to one programme. In response to demand DAI has responded with new initiatives that aim to support students with Specific Learning Differences (SpLDs) in Singapore and the ASEAN region.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE SUB PROGRAMME

This programme is intended for students with Specific Learning Differences such as Dyslexia, Maths Learning Difficulties, who seek or require one to one Specialist Tutoring.

The programme is open to Preschool students at risk of Dyslexia as well as to Primary, Secondary, and tertiary students with a valid diagnosis of a Specific Learning Difference.

WHO THE PROGRAMME IS FOR


The aim of Specialist Tutoring is to effectively support the development of each child. Each child is seen as an active, competent learner, especially children who have Specific learning differences (SpLD), wanting and in need of a value-added programme / specialist support. Specialist tutoring is individually tailored, based on the profile of the child obtained both externally through previous psychological reports or through our in-house psycho-educational assessments, and in consultation with parents and educators.

Specialist Tutoring further supports the learning needs of our more challenged students who may have difficulty entering International schools in Singapore.

5 PLUS + PACKAGE MODEL:

- 1. Overseas client comes to Singapore for a psychological assessment
- 2. Receives Intensive Specialist Tutoring (10 or 20 hours) in Singapore
- 3. Concurrently Parent may also seek to attend DAS Academy Training Courses whilst child is receiving Specialist Tutoring in Singapore
- 4. Follows up with the Online Specialist tutoring (Online Specialist Tutoring)
- 5. Receives periodic Intensive Specialist Tutoring (10 or 20 hours) in Singapore



MOE STUDENTS VS INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS SINCE 2012 TO 2019/20

We can see a clear trend in the Ministry of Education students versus the International students we have supported from 2012 to 2020. We have found that previously whilst we saw mostly expatriates who attended elite international schools like UWCSEA, Canadian School, Tanglin Trust, SJI International & Dulwich College in the early years.


However, toward 2015 onwards we saw an exodus of expats that were on expat terms of employment. The trend we have seen is for more students from MOE schools access the services of Specialist tutoring. A crop of "no frills" however have emerged in recent years that aim through significant reduced fees the international community who require international schools for their children. This would include schools such as Middleton International, One World International, Chatsworth International all promoting lower published fees with less features such as no swimming pools or running tracks.



SOURCES OF REFERRAL


Referrals for Specialist tutoring continued for 2019 to be coming through from the DAS International website or referrals from psychological assessments conducted by SAS assessments.








Grade levels for Specialist tutoring reflect the main grade levels of Primary 4 to 6 having the most number of students at 26 reflecting the parents concern as they reach upper primary and the demands of the curriculum are increased for Maths and Literacy.

FREQUENCY OF ATTENDANCE ON SPECIALIST TUTORING

In 2019/20 we saw an increase in the number of students requesting for more than 2 hours of specialist tutoring. This is a positive indication that parents see the benefit of the programme

In total from April 2019 to March 2020 18 outreach efforts with the International Schools were conducted through:

- Ongoing awareness talks,
- Information sharing
- Case meetings with the heads of department and learning support

QUALITY ASSURANCE

Classroom observations for all DAS International Specialist teachers are conducted once every financial year to ensure that our teachers uphold the standards of quality teaching set out by the organization. All Specialist Teachers are evaluated on their Individual Education Plan (IEP), lesson planning, lesson execution, communication, and classroom management to meet the IEP objectives. A total of 8 Specialist Teachers were assessed for quality assurance in classroom teaching practices in 2019-2020. The observations were conducted by the Head of DAS International and contributing members for Specialist Tutoring who are Senior Educational Therapists. The observations were conducted either through in-class or video observations of their lessons.

TEACHER TRAINING

A total of 4 educational therapists, with at least 2 years of experience teaching literacy to students with dyslexia, were trained and they underwent the 15-hour Certificate in Individualized Education Programme (IEP) Planning for an SpLD Learner by DAS Academy, followed by a 5-week practicum with 2 informal and formal observations. In addition, they attended 2 insets conducted by the Head of

DAS International. These inset sessions addressed issues such as IEP planning, parent communication, and translating what they had learnt into meeting the one to one IEP short term and long-term goals for their students.

DESCRIPTION OF INITIATIVES TAKEN THIS FINANCIAL YEAR

In line with the DAS International key efforts to outreach to likeminded organizations in the Asia Pacific Region, we initiated at the Unite SpLd 2019 conference, the hosting of a highly successful International session. We had an impressive and diverse line up of speakers from the Dyslexia Association of Kenya Phyllis Wamucii Munyi-Kariuki Founder and director of the Dyslexia Organization, Kenya (DOK), President of the Indonesia Dyslexia Association Dr. Kristiantini Dewi, Sp.A and Masarrat Khan is the Chief Executive Officer of the Maharashtra Dyslexia Association (MDA) to share their invaluable experiences and journey in support of students with Specific Learning Differences to a captive audience of international participants and speakers.

Through networking efforts, this has since translated into overseas training contracts with several organisations for FY 2019/20. DAS International training conducted several training assignments in China on "Understanding Dyslexia and Supporting Learners in Chinese" on 30 June to 1 July 2019 at Shenzhen Children's hospital and "Supporting your child in Chinese" on 14 and 15 December 2019, in Shenzhen and Guangzhou. The training sessions were well attended by parents, educators and researchers.

The trainings were delivered and led by Ms Priscillia Shen Peixi, Assistant Head of DAS Academy. DAS Academy lecturers received positive feedback for their innovative and hands-on style of delivery. One of the participants from Guangzhou mentioned: "This is just one of the positive feedback we got from the participants. We are really happy to see that our knowledge and experience could help parents and educators there. The training is indeed meaningful". DAS International looks forward to 2020 in facilitating future training opportunities in China and the Asia Pacific Region.
